TORONTO, ON (August 25, 2009) – If anyone in the nation’s capital has celebrity stature it’s Bank of Canada Governor Mark Carney. Youthful and energetic with a disarming candor, Carney has emerged as Canada’s leading figure on the international stage during the economic crisis. He was the sole Canadian on The Financial Times’ list of “Fifty who will frame the way forward,” writing that “the youthful Mr. Carney continues the tradition of impressive Canadian governors.”

Since his appointment in February 2008, Carney has been forced to confront one white-knuckle decision after another. Believing that the financial community overestimated the severity of the recession, Carney announced in late July that the recession was over, forecasting a 3 per cent growth for 2010.
